### **REPORTS FOR JANUARY2023 MEETING**

### **SEG Report**

Since the last SEG meeting, my main function has changed to helping other groups reduce their population's carbon footprint. This is where I think my time will have the biggest impact on the climate emergency. I have worked closely with Kensa to introduce the Heat the Streets business model to other groups. In most cases this has been rolled into a single visit to see the Kensa display and PV/battery display at The Stithians Centre, drilling in progress, a presentation by Kensa at my home, followed by a look at what eco retrofit measures we put in place. There has been a very good response to these visits with more being planned for 2023, including one from Exeter Uni students studying architecture.

### Visits so far:-

I visited **Climate Action Plymouth** (CAP). This was followed up with them visiting Stithians. CAP are releasing another book, 'Combustion-free Heat Power and Energy for Plymouth'. I have been invited to the launch on 4th Feb at the University of Plymouth along with Kensa and a member of SPC if anyone would like to attend.

Kensa and I gave a talk at **Playing Place** on HtS and the retrofit to a University of the Third Age group. (35 attended)

Exeter Uni Penryn Campus. We had a coachload of 28 mature students studying retrofitting

Visit from Mevagissey/Roseland group.

I attended **Pensilva**'s (Liskeard) future proofing homes event and helped facilitate a retrofit workshop.

A visit from Chacewater group.

I took the opportunity to talk about the possibility of a West Cornwall Green Open Doors event, more about this later.

There has also been in the region of 40 local/Stithians people interested in just the retrofit.

A lot of these leads have come from the Guardian article. I was also interviewed by an independent reporter and that article has just been released on Cornwall Live. See link https://www.cornwalllive.com/news/cornwall-news/cornwall-village-pioneers-money-saving7925204

### SEG funds.

Thanks to Phil's efforts, he has managed to get £1,000 of funding for SEG. Our challenge now is to find the best use for this money.

### Community car

I still have not sorted insurance for the community car. However, the car has been lent out for another two-month period. It is being used for local trips to Penryn, Redruth, school runs etc.

### Public EV charge point

Building for Humanity have said they will fund this using Connected Kerb as the installer. I chased this back in November with B f H and followed up with a phone call asking for an update. No update from them so far.

I don't think it's practical to have a community EV until we have this in place.

### Wadebridge Renewable Energy Network (WREN)

I have been asked to take part in a peer review of the WREN's draft guide for communities. They have now released their NZCom Tool which I have been trialling over the last few days. At the moment I can't see how this would be useful to individuals, or a group such as SEG, in predicting a path to Net Zero. There just isn't the detail or inclusion of latest technologies to make an accurate prediction for Net Zero. They are also using (EPC) Energy Performance Certificate ratings that I know are being revised. However, there is a Zoom meeting on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> Jan when I can raise these points.

### Wendron

There is a proposal for a Geothermal project in the parish of Wendron. From what I have been told Wendron PC are strongly opposed to any development and are also not interested in considering declaring a climate emergency, so possibly don't understand the importance of the project. I have met with a parishioner who does understands its importance. He thinks there are many arguments for supporting the development and is trying to maximise its chances in the area. He has seen what Stithians has done with the Heat the Streets and wonders if there are any parallels he can draw on. I have told him that after declaring a climate emergency, SPC went on to compile a 23-point plan. I sent him a copy of the plan and he has pulled out six points that he hopes Wendron PC will adopt and eventually realise that they could and should declare a climate emergency.

### **Battery storage Bron Coys**

RES have said they are happy to meet with SEG to answer any further questions we might have. I have not heard back from SEG members so assume they are OK with the questions I have already asked. I have sent SPC (Jane) a copy of these questions and a copy of RES's answers. There has been a written objection to the storage proposal sent to SPC and I have sent a response to this to Cllr Joy Thomas and Clerk Jane Richards.

### **Green Open Doors event**

The Chacewater group and I discussed the possibility of a West Cornwall Green Open Doors event. The idea was generally accepted but West Cornwall could be a bit ambitious, and it might be better to keep it more local. I said when SEG discussed a date we thought Earth Day 22nd April would be good. Chacewater also suggested a booklet covering the changes participants had made to their homes might be useful. This booklet could then be used at other events to encourage others to make changes. We decided to bear the idea in mind, give it some thought and get together again.

### REPORT:

### Stithians Community Flood Plan Update

The community flood group have not met for a while, with the last meeting being in June 2022. At this meeting we agreed on a poster campaign on reporting flood issues for local notice boards and a recruitment poster for the Stithians Show to recruit more volunteers. The notice board posters are still a work in progress and unfortunately no volunteers have come forward as a result of the Stithians Show poster and other recruitment efforts.

The period of inactivity since June 2022 has largely been due to being unable to make contact with the Community Flood Forum contact, Molly, who is advising and guiding the group. I have now established that she has left this post and her role has not been filled. We are now waiting for the Flood Forum to recruit a new adviser so that we can progress with formulating the plan and the flood watch training.

Some progress has been made on establishing areas for natural flood mitigation, with our Wildlife Trust contact, Steph, preparing some flow path route diagrams for two rivers that we have identified as occasional flood risks.

The issues with sewage flooding at Hendra and Foundry still seem to be causing problems and hopefully the Flood Forum can initiate a meeting with SWW and the Flood Group/Parish Council to try and resolve the issues.

### ILLUMINATION OF THE FOOTPATH THROUGH THE CHURCHYARD

**Decision Required:** 

To agree next steps

### REPORT:

The following correspondence has been received from a resident:

"The main footpath between Hendra and Stithians village passes through the church graveyard. It is lit only by streetlights at either end. There is a light over the entrance to the church which illuminates that part of the footpath where it runs along the side of the church, but the switch is inside the church, and it is usually switched off. This path, used by the community, can be very hard to see at night, especially where it bends around towards the west gate onto the road.

This path that runs across the graveyard belongs to the church, but as it is used by the community generally, there is a case for Cornwall Council to provide adequate illumination as a safeguarding issue. There is a risk of someone walking into a gravestone in the dark, or of criminal activity where the culprit can hide in the dark. The alternative is for the public to walk along the road, but there is no pavement there. I have heard the reason is that the graveyard wall near the road junction cannot be removed because it contains the plague pit. I do not know if there is any evidence for this.

Would the SPC make representation to the Cornwall Council to install one or more streetlights in the graveyard so that the footpath is well lit and less of a risk for pedestrians? Would it be desirable for the Cornwall Council to take on the maintenance of this footpath? I understand that the graveyard, or parts of it, cannot be returned to Cormac for maintenance, because the graveyard was never officially opened, and therefore cannot be officially closed, but this may refer only to the lower part of the graveyard, which does not contain the footpath.

"Absolutely. The process will be that you can come via myself to get an application form and have a discussion with one of the workers. We will then endeavour to get a decision and grant out within weeks. However we are still waiting, along with all the other strands of shared prosperity and levelling up for the govt to sign it off. We plan to go live in Feb but govt delays might hinder that, but it sounds like a good fit, so I will add you to my list of people to contact as soon as we are able."
