REPORTS FOR APRIL 2024 MEETING

SEG Report to SPC 16-04-2024

REACH: Rural Energy and Community Heat (funding opportunity)

Cllr. Phil Blease and I had our meeting prior to the REACH Zoom workshop (26^{th} March) to put together a proposal for Stithians.

Because it was difficult to see what sort of project REACH were looking for we put together a main proposal but also had a back-up proposal in case the workshops were going in a different direction. Our main proposal was to produce an educational film on building retrofits and our back-up was to explore battery storage. Phil and I were fortunate in attending separate workshop breakout rooms giving us the opportunity to pursue both proposals. The educational film was not what they were looking for, so we pursued the battery storage proposal which they did show some interest in.

Because energy storage appeared to be the sort of project they were interested in, I filled out the REACH detailed questionnaire with this in mind. It was filled out on behalf of SPC and SEG, stating that SPC will take the lead in the project, but that SEG will work closely with the SPC to bring the project to a successful conclusion. The closing date for the questionnaire was 9th April, it was submitted on the 5th April, and we should have a reply by 26th April to say if we have been shortlisted to 5-10 applicants.

Below in italics is the main proposal: -

Our proposal is to explore the possibilities of Community Energy storage. Ideally this storage would be in the form of a container size battery that could be used to balance demand on the grid as well as provide our rural community with lower price electricity thereby also helping to reduce fuel poverty. However, if this is not plausible, we are also interested in providing storage in domestic batteries, Vehicle to Home (V2H) and Vehicle to Grid (V2G). We have experience with home batteries when run in conjunction with a Time of Use tariff, reducing our energy bill by 50 per cent. We also have experience of the benefits of V2H. Stithians has reduced its carbon footprint through the early adoption of Air Source Heat Pumps

and Ground Source Heat Pumps (Heat the Streets project). We estimate there are about 20% of the 550 homes now on ASHPs or GSHPs. It would be great to demonstrate how well these technologies work together to further reduce our carbon emissions and energy bills. Stithians Energy Group has a good track record when it comes to engaging with the public on new technologies and to be able to demonstrate heat pumps working in conjunction with energy storage we think would be extremely beneficial.

Ground source heat pumps for schools.

A Zoom meeting was held between Christine (deputy head of Wallop school, Hampshire), Nikki Jones (fundraiser), me and Andy (Hampshire school buildings officer). Andy was very helpful but thought it would be quite challenging to raise enough money.

Christine and I showed Nikki around the school, and it was apparent that the insulation levels were very poor. I have sent Wouter Thijssen (Kensa MD), photos and plans of Wallop school so they can provide us with an idea of installation costs.

Events

I attended two of the three days at Fully Charged (Everything Electric) at ExCel London. As well as looking around the various green tec trade stands I attended numerous talks, these help me to keep up to date with the way technology is progressing. It was of particular interest to see Vehicle to Grid (V2G) being discussed for energy storage.

Help for SEG

Because there has not been any interest from parishioners regarding help for SEG, Phil has said he will pass on some of his other PC activities so that he can concentrate on the climate emergency issues.

Contacts

I met up with Jonathan Ferrier from Eynsham, Oxfordshire (Helen's lead) at Fully Charged. He wants to do similar to Stithians in helping reduce their carbon footprint.

The Stithians Times

The new issue of The Stithians Times is available and I have written an article entitled TWO MAJOR TRANSITION PROJECTS IN CORNWALL and features my visit to the geothermal project at United Downs and my granddaughter's article about South Crofty opening for tin production again.

Film

Although REACH didn't want the film project Phil and I think this could be a great way to ngage with people on how to green retrofit their homes. Phil has found some funding options that he will be exploring.

Off the back of the St Cleer talk I have been contacted by Joe and Tony from St Ive parish who would like to make a similar film. (tony@tonyhillfilms.com) They are looking to come down in early May.

Clerk's Report for Meeting on 16th April 2024

11.1 Final Accounts for 2023/24

Summary of Decisions Required (Details in report):

1. To approve the final accounts for the 2023/24 Financial Year as detailed in the report.

2. To approve the allocation of interest payments.

3. To approve the allocation of the remaining budget of £146.49 to the Pavilion Replacement Fund.

Report:

Final Accounts for 2023/24:

As Members are aware, it is normal practice to report the Council's current financial position at this point on the agenda. In April, however, the final accounts for the previous financial year take precedence. I can, confirm that we have received the first instalment of the Precept for 2024/25 and that there are sufficient funds in the account to pay the invoices presented for authorisation at Item 18.

The following financial Reports, as of 31st March 2024 are attached:

Calculation of Interest for year 23/24

These reports have been submitted to the internal auditor, the audit will be concluded after the date of this meeting, therefore his report will be considered at the May meeting.

Allocation of Outstanding Funds from 23/24:

The Expenditure Budget was £2,425 underspent and Income Budget showed a variance of £270.97 the total remaining from the 2023 / 24 Budget is therefore £2,154.03, which transfers into the General Fund, this now stands at £47,656.74. Earmarked Reserves account for a further £121,340.65.

Once the Interest payments detailed in the attached report have been allocated to the relevant reserves it will leave a balance of £146.49. Under Minute 06/03/13(2), it was resolved that any underspend should be transferred to the Pavilion Replacement Fund.

2023/024 saw considerable expenditure from the Ear Marked Reserves, £23,895.75 from the Playing Field Development Fund and £9,500 spend from the Institute Funds.

Copies of the Asset Register and a Statement of the various PWLB Loans are attached to this report.

As Members have previously been made aware, the total value of the Council's assets for audit purposes does not change year on year unless an asset is either disposed of or acquired.

If Members have any queries on the final accounts, please advise me of them prior to the meeting so that I can prepare a suitable response.

To consider Renewal of the Membership of Cornwall Association of Local Councils (CALC) & NALC

Decision Required:

Decision regarding the renewal of the Membership to CALC / NALC for 2024 / 25.

Report:

The invoice for annual membership has been received, this amounts to £862.58, Members are asked to consider the renewal of the subscription to CALC / NALC.

I can advise Members that during 2023/24 I have not contacted CALC for any advice or guidance on any Parish Council matters, little information has been supplied that is not available from other sources, such as the Society for Local Council Clerks (SLCC), local forums or fellow Clerks.

Training sessions are provided, however, no courses have been booked by Stithians Parish Council in the past 2 years - it should be noted that these courses incur an additional charge in addition to the annual membership.

The Council has been invited to attend the CALC Annual General Meeting in recent years, but have not sent a representative.

Having reviewed the service they have offered over the last 12 months, I would ask the Members to consider not renewing the membership of CALC / NALC for 2024/25.

Notice Board / Brief Rules for Meadowside Cemetery. 11.3

Decision Required:

To agree quotes are sourced for the provision of general information notice boards for Meadowsie Cemtery.

The rules and regulations pertaining to Meadowside Cemetery are published on the website and are routinely provided to residents who reserve a plot in the Cemetery and families organising a burial of a family member. However, it is appreciated that families are clearly not in a position to understanding what is or is not permissible when dealing with the loss of a family member.

I am therefore recommending that a simple sign is placed at each entrance to Meadowside, that briefly outlines the expectations, suggested wording is as follows:

MEADOWSIDE LAWN CEMETERY

Everyone is welcome to visit the Cemetery please respect the peace and dignity of these facilities as well as other users.

To facilitate its upkeep and maintenance Meadowside Cemetery is designated as a lawned cemetery.

Only headstones are allowed and graves must not be planted. Please note that whilst dogs are permitted in the cemetery they must be kept on a lead at all times without exception. Please clean up after your dog.
