REPORTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2024 MEETING

SEG Report to SPC 17-09-2024

Cornwall Council's Housing Decarbonisation Strategy (Draft).

I reviewed CC's draft strategy as a resident rather than a member of Stithians Energy Group (SEG), however SEG was mentioned in some of my comments. I shared my comments with Cllr Phil Blease who I understand submitted a response on behalf of the Parish Council.

Because successive governments have failed to tackle the climate emergency we have very, very little time left to reduce our carbon emissions and whereas the normal approach would be to improve the insulation first, fabric first, time does not permit this approach. The single most important measure to decarbonise Cornwall's homes would be to replace fossil fuel boilers which account for 76% of home emissions. This is why Cornwall Council's draft strategy suggests tackling home heating and hot water first with heat pumps expected to be the main technical solution. I have endorsed this approach.

<u>The Stithians Times.</u> My latest article for TST is on Heat Pumps and Cornwall Council's strategy to make this technology the main solution.

<u>Films.</u> It has been helpful for me to be able to direct people to Stithians Energy Group's website to see the film of our eco retrofit.

I would recommend watching Cornwall Climate Care's film Power to the People on YouTube. It features Cornwall and many of the green initiatives going on here including Heat the Streets in Stithians.

<u>Ground source heat pumps for schools.</u> I will be emailing Kensa to say to hold back on a quote for the heat pump for Wallop school because there's considerable disruption at the school with a pending change of Head Teacher and Ofsted.

Visits.

Katherine, my daughter, has just changed jobs to work for Ameresco (City Leap Bristol). Ameresco is in partnership with Bristol City Council to provide green infrastructure which includes heat pumps and district heat networks across the city. Hopefully there's a lot for me to learn from what they are doing. Last week she took me to a large installation that extracts low grade heat from the water in the harbour, feeds it into a heat pump and then distributes it to provide heat and hot water to an equivalent of 5,000 homes in the city.

Meeting with our new MP Perran Moon at The Stithians Centre.

Our meeting ran well over the allocated 15min, and I came away feeling that the meeting was "Positive Plus" regarding climate change.

Topics discussed: -

- 1. Heat the Streets
- 2. Rosebank oil field
- 3. Public awareness of climate change
- 4. Private cars to pay for road use per mile.
- 5. Move faster on renewables, transport and home insulation.
- 6. Tourist levy

I left Perran a copy of my notes as a reminder of what was discussed. In the appendix to this report I have included Perran's replies.

Heat pump research request

There was a posting on Stithians noticeboard regarding help with research on heat pumps. I followed this up and it is research being carried out by Dr Valentine Seymour at the University of Portsmouth. 'The aim of the project is to better understand perceived 'real-world' viability and how acceptable the different technology options being in the project are (e.g., air, ground, chemically-assisted and water-source heat pumps, etc.) for home heating in the UK amongst members of the public'.

Both Phil Blease and I have volunteered to help with this, and I think our experience with Heat the Streets could be useful.

APPENDIX

Notes for surgery with Perran Moon 31st Aug

My notes are in black text. Blue text is what was said and comments.

Note from Phil Blease (PC vice chairman):- Please tell Perran "We are all behind you, and climate change should be this government's number one priority. PS and all governments for that matter." Quoted Phil's comment to Perran, and went on to say how the PC had been extremely supportive of SEG and declared a climate emergency in 2019. He was told Phil was Chairman at that time.

- 1. Check that Perran knows about Heat the Streets. Perran knew about Heat the Streets and had visited Kensa. Sounds as though they had given him a good description of the project. I pointed out that I thought the project had great potential for the UK and to that end I had been helping to promote it including promoting with Kensa at FutureBuild. Also mentioned that when the project was going on I had invited other groups to see work going on and at the same time look at our eco-retrofit home. Even though he was quite well informed of the HtS project, I passed him a Kensa leaflet and a copy of the Guardian article describing the project.
- 2. Rosebank. Reply to my brother from Simon Opher Labour MP for Stroud. The Prime Minister had said in the run up to the election that the Rosebank oil field licence would stand. This remains the case. But your argument is a strong one and given the potential for environmental damage let alone the many more years of fossil fuel pollution from the oil and gas eventually mined from Rosebank I wonder whether the Government should reconsider.

I shall therefore be writing to the Secretary of State, making your points and requesting a review of this decision to proceed with the licence.

- On Thur, the UK government announced that it will **NOT** defend the last government's decision to approve the Rosebank oil field. I made the statement that Rosebank must be stopped. He said he was not up to speed on the latest developments. He didn't know that Labour had just announced that they will **NOT** defend the last government's decision to approve the Rosebank oil field. I passed him an A4 sheet of all the reasons why Rosebank should not happen, the sheet is attached to the end of these notes.
- 3. More public awareness of climate change. All media, social media, Cornwall Council. Mentioned this saying we must get people on board. Told him about how we produced a 40-page booklet in 2019, Climate Change Explained and delivered this to houses in Stithians and surrounding areas and that it had now gone viral. He asked for the copy I had taken along, I pointed out that it was now out of date. I mentioned that the booklet

finished on a positive note, saying how good a zero carbon Briton could be. This prompted him to highlight the many possibilities that there is in Cornwall, offshore wind, onshore wind, solar, geothermal, lithium, tin etc. this brought us on to the subject of highly skilled jobs and I stated the urgency in training for these jobs.

- 4. Private cars to pay for road use per mile. Revenue from this to be used for road maintenance and a vastly improved public transport system, buses and trains. Rural areas might need some relief with this. Remove vehicle tax. Brought this to his attention by saying this will not be very popular but that we can't keep adding more and more cars to the roads. We must have a better public transport system. His comment was "Why do I think our public transport system is so bad compared to other European countries?" and of course it's because they a not privatised. Hinting that Labour will take them back into public ownership.
- 5. Move faster on renewables, transport and home insulation. Mentioned this. He agreed, making comments like, "I was pushing against an open door."
- 6. Tourist levy. Pay a levy that provides tourists with free public transport, bus and rail. Also helps towards providing increased water, water quality both sea and river. He seemed to think there might be a possibility for this. He acknowledged that European countries do this, and that Edinburgh is introducing a scheme.
- 7. Help community car clubs get established. Didn't get to this, ran out of time.
- 8. Encourage more sustainable farming. Didn't get to this, ran out of time.

Reasons why Rosebank should not happen.

Congratulations on your recent election as my representative in Parliament. As your constituent, I am writing to urge you to stop the controversial Rosebank oil field and all new oil and gas projects, and to champion a rapid and just transition to renewable energy. Despite widespread opposition, the last government approved the Rosebank oil field, the biggest undeveloped oil field in the UK's North Sea.

Here's why we need to stop Rosebank:

- 1. Scientists and experts have warned time and time again that we cannot allow any more new oil and gas if we are to keep within safe climate limits. Just burning the fossil fuels in existing UK oil and gas fields will contribute to pushing us past "safe" climate limits. Adding new reserves, like Rosebank, will bust UK climate targets and push us closer to more parts of our world becoming uninhabitable.
- 2. We know that new oil and gas projects like the Rosebank oil field won't lower our energy bills, or make our energy supply more secure. Most of the UK's oil and gas is sold on the open international market to the highest bidder, bringing in profit for oil and gas companies whilst millions of people across the country struggle to pay their energy bills.
- 3. The public just elected a government that pledged to build a clean, British energy system and tackle the climate crisis. There is a strong popular mandate for the transition away from oil and gas to renewable energy to create new jobs, lower bills, boost the economy and ensure a liveable climate. People voted for change, not more of the same.
- 4. New fields like Rosebank won't stem the decline of jobs in the North Sea, because the North Sea basin is in decline. Over the past decade, the number of jobs supported by the oil and gas industry in the UK has more than halved, despite new fields being approved. In a declining basin, the only way to create long term, secure jobs is to invest in a just transition and support workers into clean energy industries that have a future.
- 5. Rosebank is right next to a marine protected area and threatens endangered species that call it home. Loud drilling, seismic blasting and construction at Rosebank will disturb dolphins, whales and fish potentially disrupting their behaviour and migration, and even causing deaths. The pipeline needed to transport the tiny amount of gas reserves would cut through a specially protected seabed the Faroe-Shetland Sponge Belt. It could harm extraordinary creatures like clams that can live for over 500 years some of the oldest animals on the planet.

Instead of new fossil fuel projects we urgently need a plan for a just and properly funded transition for oil and gas workers and the communities that depend on them, and real solutions to fix our broken energy system. The approval of Rosebank is also being challenged in the courts as unlawful.

As my representative in parliament, I call on you to:

- 1. Be vocal about your opposition to the Rosebank oil field in Parliament, in the press and on social media.
- 2. Advocate for Rosebank to be rejected, should the court case against Rosebank's approval be successful and Equinor resubmits it for government approval.
- 3. Support an end to new oil and gas projects, in line with what is urgently required to prevent catastrophic climate breakdown.
- 4. Back a plan for a properly funded just transition for oil and gas workers and the communities that depend on them. This plan must get into the specifics of where and how jobs will be created, backed up with investment, as well as making it easier for workers to retrain, providing job guarantees, and improving the quality of offshore energy jobs.
- 5. Focus on the real solutions to tackle Britain's broken energy system, including scaling up renewables and insulating our leaky homes.

For a safe climate and affordable energy, we need to stop expanding oil and gas production. As we face climate impacts in our area and with many millions in energy debt across the country, we are looking to you to address the climate crisis and fix our broken energy system. Will you be the champion that our constituency needs?

Background:

The proposed works to the trees subject to a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) are essential for maintaining the safety and integrity of the property and its surroundings. The removal of the lowest limbs and branches of the large Monterey pine (T1) will mitigate the risk of damage to the house and lane, especially considering the increased wind-loading due to the anticipated removal of a dying ash tree in the adjacent property. Similarly, the crown lift of the large turkey oak (T2) to 5.5 meters will ensure adequate clearance from the dwelling, reducing shading and preventing further crown development over the roof.

These measures are carefully planned to balance the health and aesthetics of the trees with the safety and comfort of the residents.
